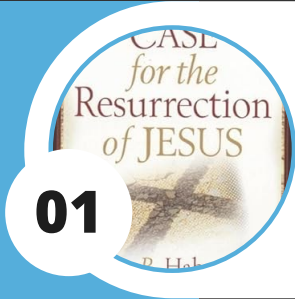

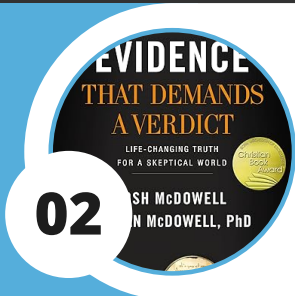

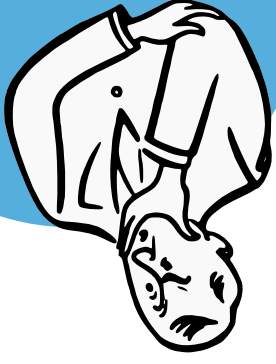

Challenge Yourself!

Think about how would you respond to each of the objections below...

- The disciples probably just experienced hallucinations
- Jesus' followers likely stole the body from the tomb
- "Swoon theory" - Jesus fainted from exhaustion but didn't actually die on the cross
- Jesus only appeared to die on the cross, but was actually swapped with another person (this is the Islamic claim)



The "Minimal Facts" of the Resurrection

- 01 Jesus died by crucifixion
- 02 Disciples genuinely believed to have seen the risen Christ
- 03 Disciples were radically changed and willing to die for what they claimed to have seen
- 04 Resurrection was attested early, not as a later development
- 05 Conversion of the skeptic brother, James
- 06 Dramatic conversion of the Christian persecutor, Paul

The "Minimal Facts" are data points that are so strongly attested historically that they are granted by nearly every scholar of the subject - including the skeptical ones

Additional Supporting Details

- The tomb was empty
- Women were first to arrive at the tomb and report the risen Christ*
- Thousands of Jews began worshipping on Sunday
- There is considerable evidence for the martyrdom of Peter, Paul, & James

**Culturally in the first century the testimony of women was looked down upon and this would not have been a detail someone would make up in order to make their case more believable*
